In these cases, it is permissible to produce supporting studies from direct observation and to produce the final examination piece using the supporting studies as reference points.

At the end of the examination, fasten **all** your work securely together at the top left-hand corner of each sheet.

All questions in this paper carry equal marks.

You should make a study or studies from direct observation from **one** of the following. You should discuss your work with your Art Teacher during the preparatory period. Studies may be either the whole or part of the object. Small specimens or details may be enlarged.

1 Still Life Group

Either (a) A bunch of long-stemmed flowers, some of which are placed in a glass vase, others scattered on a patterned tablecloth. The arrangement should also include coloured ribbon and an additional vase or bowl.

Or (b) A group of objects which expresses the activity of a specific hobby.

2 Natural and Man Made Objects

Either (a) A man's **and** a woman's wristwatch.

Or (b) A sandwich on a plate.

Or (c) A number of interesting shells.

3 The Human Figure

Either (a) One or two figures are seated on the edge of a table. One foot is resting on a stool, the other on the floor. The whole figure should be included.

Or (b) A portrait study of a person viewed in a strong side light. As well as the head, the upper body and hands should be included.

4 Interiors or Exteriors

Either (a) A view from an upstairs window.

Or (b) A corner of a shed or greenhouse.

Or (c) A close-up view of part of a car.
