## General information about practical exams

Centres must follow the guidance on science practical exams given in the *Cambridge Handbook*.

### Safety

Supervisors must follow national and local regulations relating to safety and first aid.

Only those procedures described in the question paper should be attempted.

Supervisors must inform candidates that materials and apparatus used in the exam should be treated with caution. Suitable eye protection should be used where necessary.

Hazard data sheets relating to substances used in this exam should be available from your chemical supplier.

### Before the exam

- The packets containing the question papers must **not** be opened before the exam.
- It is assumed that standard school laboratory facilities, as indicated in the *Guide to Planning Practical Science*, will be available.
- Spare materials and apparatus for the tasks set must be available for candidates, if required.

### During the exam

- It must be made clear to candidates at the start of the exam that they may request spare materials and apparatus for the tasks set.
- Where specified, the supervisor **must** perform the experiments and record the results as instructed. This must be done **out of sight** of the candidates, using the same materials and apparatus as the candidates.
- Any assistance provided to candidates must be recorded in the supervisor's report.
- If any materials or apparatus need to be replaced, for example, in the event of breakage or loss, this must be recorded in the supervisor's report.

### After the exam

- The supervisor must complete a report for each practical session held and each laboratory used.
- Each packet of scripts returned to Cambridge International must contain the following items:
  - the scripts of the candidates specified on the bar code label provided
  - the supervisor's results relevant to these candidates

## Specific information for this practical exam

Each candidate should be provided with:

**Preparation of materials***dialysis tubing bags, D*

A 20 cm length of dialysis (Visking) tubing should be soaked for a few minutes in distilled water and then tied with a tight knot approximately 1 cm from one end, to form a bag. Candidates will require two dialysis tubing bags each. These should be presented to candidates in a beaker which contains enough distilled water to cover the dialysis tubing bags. The beaker should be labelled **D**.

*1% vitamin C solution, V*

This should be prepared by dissolving 1 g of vitamin C (ascorbic acid) in 80 cm<sup>3</sup> of distilled water and making up to 100 cm<sup>3</sup> with more distilled water.

*1% DCPIP solution, DCPIP*

This should be prepared by dissolving 1 g of DCPIP (2,6-dichlorophenolindophenol) **[HH] [MH] [N]** in 80 cm<sup>3</sup> of distilled water and making up to 100 cm<sup>3</sup> with more distilled water. The DCPIP is difficult to dissolve and should be prepared the day before the exam and stirred well. It must be filtered using standard grade filter paper (such as Whatman grade 1) to remove any undissolved DCPIP before use.
