Narrative Writing

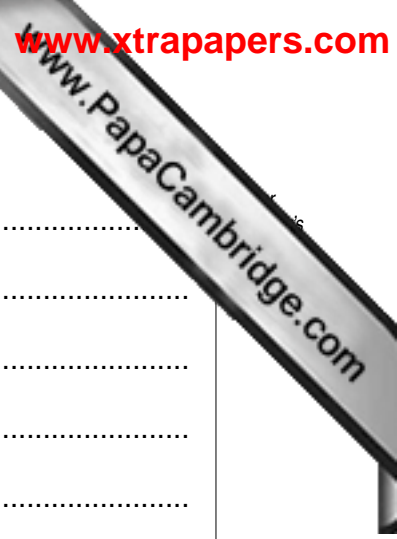
4 (a) Write a story entitled 'The Great Pretender'.
