This specification gives candidates an excellent grounding in all aspects of the French language, with the opportunity to demonstrate their ability in speaking, listening, reading and writing as well as to study social and cultural aspects of the French speaking world.

Unit title	Description	Mandatory/Optional?
Speaking 2	Topics include society, the environment, science and technology, culture. Activities are discussion of article and topic discussion.	Mandatory
Listening, Reading and Writing 2	Topics include society, the environment, science and technology, culture. Activities are listening, reading, writing and responding in French/English.	Mandatory

How is this qualification assessed?

All units are externally assessed – the multi-skill units through a written paper and the speaking units either through a visiting examiner (20+ candidates from the same centre) or through submitting recorded tests. Speaking tests are taken before the main examination period.
