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#### **General Marking Guidance**

- All candidates must receive the same treatment. Examiners must mark the first candidate in exactly the same way as they mark the last.
- Mark schemes should be applied positively. Candidates must be rewarded for what they have shown they can do rather than penalised for omissions.
- Examiners should mark according to the mark scheme not according to their perception of where the grade boundaries may lie.
- There is no ceiling on achievement. All marks on the mark scheme should be used appropriately.
- All the marks on the mark scheme are designed to be awarded. Examiners should always award full marks if deserved, i.e. if the answer matches the mark scheme. Examiners should also be prepared to award zero marks if the candidate's response is not worthy of credit according to the mark scheme.
- Where some judgement is required, mark schemes will provide the principles by which marks will be awarded and exemplification may be limited.
- When examiners are in doubt regarding the application of the mark scheme to a candidate's response, the team leader must be consulted.
- Crossed out work should be marked UNLESS the candidate has replaced it with an alternative response.

#### **GENERAL COMMENTS FOR 4ESO PAPER 02R MARKERS**

- 1. The word limit must be adhered to.
  The maximum word limit for ALL questions is THREE words.
- 2. Responses must be grammatically logical. Furthermore, there must not be any repetition of words.

  For example, Q 5 if the candidate has put a small rucksack, this should response should be marked as incorrect because the sentence now reads with the word a repeated.
- 3. Spelling markers should exercise a degree of tolerance with regard to spelling accuracy.

  If the word, when uttered, sounds correct, the response should be marked as <u>correct</u>. However, the response should be marked as <u>incorrect</u> if a different word has been written e.g. Q6 plastic souls for plastic soles.
- 4. Use of capital letters is acceptable.
